What will I learn on this course?

Calculate the quantity of beads needed to create bracelets of different lengths

Demonstrate an understanding of ratio and how to work with ratio, proportion and percentages

Calculate the circumference of a circle using Pi to work out the amount of wire needed to make a ring and a bangle

This course is an excellent starting point for beginners who want to explore basic metalworking and metal smithing skills or for those with a little experience who want to revisit skills.
