Ideally, you will have completed the Spanish level 1 course (modules 1& 2). You will also improve your pronunciation, revise grammar learnt in Level 1, recap on skills learnt previously and learn about cultural aspects of the life in speaking Spanish countries.

1. use 3 different forms of past tense to describe and talk about past events
2. Contrast both future forms providing at least two examples in each situation
3. Work with a partner to provide an example for roleplay in at least 2 different given situations

It is always beneficial to spend time between sessions reviewing the topics covered. Your tutor may also set home - study to help you practice. Listening to or watching films, music, radio and TV programmes in the language would be helpful for vocabulary and accent.
