WHAT WILL I LEARN ON THIS COURSE?

Learners will:

1. Create a design plan using accurate measurement for at least one project
2. Accurately transfer the design to wood to create at least one project
3. Use a large gouge (a curved shaped chisel) to remove excess wood (roughing out) to create a basic form and use appropriate tools to finish at least one design

IS THIS COURSE SUITABLE FOR ME?

This level 1A course and an excellent starting point for beginners who want to explore basic wood carving skills or for those with a little experience who want to revisit skills.

Please be aware that whilst this course is practical in nature some sessions will include theory and professional related training such as H&S, risk assessments, public liability etc

Learners will need the following tools and equipment please do not purchase until you are sure the course will run:

For your first session you will need to bring the following tools and equipment:

- Apron or overall
- Dust mask
- Basic drawing materials (pencil, rubber and sharpener)
- Pen
- No open toed shoes in the workshop

You will be provided with a sketchbook

- You will need to follow the rules of the woodwork studio to maintain Health & Safety procedures and keep yourself and others safe. Please wear closed toe shoes and bring an apron to every lesson.

WILL THERE BE ADDITIONAL COSTS?

You will require some of your own tools and wood but please wait until after your first session to buy wood and tools so that your tutor can advise you.
