What will I learn on this course?

- Number- whole numbers, fractions, decimals, percentages and ratio
- Measure, shape and space- time, money, length, weight, area, volume and geometry
- Handling Data- tables, charts, averages and probability
- Problem solving- applying maths to everyday contexts like budgeting, shopping and planning.

Is this course suitable for me?

This course is fully funded for eligible learners. To qualify, you must be aged 19 or over and not already hold a GCSE Mathematics grade 4/C (or above), or an equivalent qualification.

Before starting the course, you will complete an initial assessment. This helps us identify your current skill level and ensures that you are placed on the most appropriate course to support your learning and success.

Is there anything I need to know about the course?

This course is ideal for learners who;

- are working towards a level 1 standard
- want to improve their numeracy for everyday tasks
- are preparing to progress to Functional Skills Maths Level 2
- Need a gentle and supportive approach to learning

Will there be additional costs?

No additional costs. All materials will be provided. To support your progression, your tutor may recommend study support materials, which are not provided as part of the course.
